

### State Law Eyed on Weed-Killers

Handling of 2, 4-D, DDT Studied Here

Wisconsin will be a pioneer in the development of legislative controls for the handling of 2, 4-D and DDT, plant and insect poisons, if bills are passed by the next legislature. Sen. Melvin Olson, (R-South Wayne) said at the legislative subcommittee on agriculture met at the University of Wisconsin Wednesday.

Experts from the University college of agriculture were called in to discuss the possible need for legislative controls on use of the two materials.

**Suggests New Weed Law**

A. E. Madler, department of agriculture attorney, said that some sort of controls might be needed to limit use and application of the two poisons.

He added, however, that such controls might be put into a new weed control law.

Sen. Olson agreed that Wisconsin's weed control laws were obsolete and needed revision. He said that other states are watching Wisconsin's action on the setting up of legislation controlling 2, 4-D and DDT.

Fred Kenneth Buchholz, of the university agronomy department said that 2, 4-D was the most promising weed killing chemical ever developed.

Buchholz and Prof. George Briggs of the agronomy department both agreed that 2, 4-D had widespread acceptance among farmers and that probably 50 per cent of the state farmers are using it now.

They both warned against its indiscriminate use.

ment, said that DDT is a valuable insecticide, but that it, too, must be handled carefully because of possible ill effects.

He said that DDT is assimilated by animals when they eat forage or other crops containing DDT used as insect sprays.

The U. S. food and drug administration has not set up any standards or tolerances for the amount of the residue of DDT in meat or milk that may be allowable or safe for human usage.

It was decided to form a separate committee to study the problems further and then draft control legislation.
