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### Wright Pleads For Civic Center On Lake Monona, Warns City to 'Wake Up'

#### Noted Architect in Attack on City - County Bids Plan

A plea for a new city-center building and civic center, taking into consideration the future of Lake Monona, was outlined by the noted architect, Frank Lloyd Wright, in a speech before the Madison Civic Center Association last night.

The talk, entitled "What Madison Needs," contained many specific references to Madison architecture and centered on Mr. Wright's contention that the city should be "wakened up" by planning the future of the city.
